See the Chapel and the Museum Differently Two audioguide interpretation tours launched

Montreal, September 12, 2013 – The Marguerite Bourgeoys Museum and Notre-Dame-de-Bon-Secours Chapel, two key parts of Montreal's heritage, are proud to announce the launch of two audioguide interpretation tours. The tours, in English and French, introduce visitors to the city's oldest chapel (1771) and the Marguerite Bourgeoys Museum.

Key figures in the history of Notre-Dame-de-Bon-Secours, known as the *Sailors' Church*, explain its fascinating past. The audioguide tour also gives visitors a better appreciation of the decoration and architecture of this treasure dating back to the 17th century and to the works of art it contains. They can even listen to the lovely tones of its 1910 Casavant organ.

Touring the Museum with this multimedia guide is the perfect way to learn about the life and exceptional destiny of Marguerite Bourgeoys. The Bonsecours site and its surroundings are also highlighted through an original narrative enlivened with exclusive images, stories and first-hand accounts.

The Opus Click, a multimedia tool

The *Opus Click* is a multimedia device combining sound and images on its LCD screen. It is used by many prestigious institutions, including the *Palais des Papes* in Avignon, *MoMA* in New York and the *Baltimore Museum of Art*. The Marguerite Bourgeoys Museum is the first museum in Montreal to offer this experience.
